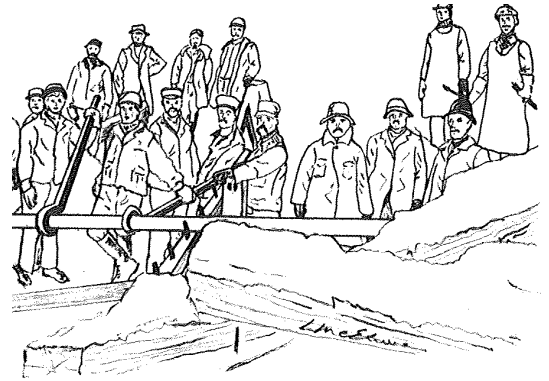


# Oil Transportation Double Puzzle

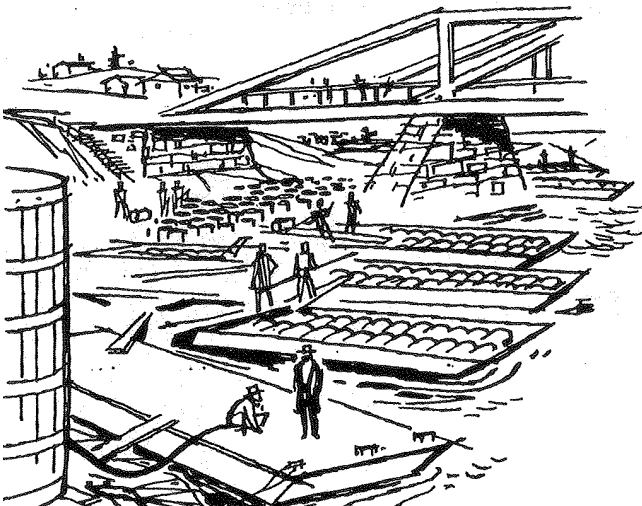
- Oil is hauled in 42-gallon  (RASBERL).
- (ESTASEMRT) were men hired to haul oil from well site to rivers or railroads.
- (SOHSER) were the animals that pulled oil tank wagons.
- Jacob J.  (VIRFADRTGEN) was a river-boat captain who became a giant in the transportation of crude oil.
- Wooden  (SARBGE) hauled barrels of oil down Oil Creek and the Allegheny River.
- The  (RESMODNE) Tank Car was the first railroad car equipped to haul oil.
- Samuel Van Syckel built the first  (LINPEEPI).
- (TEWTERDIA) was the first long-distance pipeline.

## Bonus Question:

Pennsylvania oilmen used dams along the often shallow Oil Creek to create floods that would move barges filled with oil barrels down to the Allegheny River.
